## Character Breakdown

MADISON

A confident, popular, kinda self-absorbed IG (Instagram) model. Age: teens to young adult.

This is a short piece designed for one actor. However, if a director/actors wish to include 1-2 silent roles, they may be:

BAILEY Madison's adorable rescue doggie, famous in their own right, happy to wear cute clothing for social media and give Madison friendly advice.
SNOWMAN A recently-come-to-life snowman, fine to be alive in this world, but would rather roll down a hill in the woods than stay still for a selfie on social media.

### **Setting**

Outside, winter, snowy. Christmas Eve.

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# EXCERPT

AT RISE: Christmas Eve. MADISON, teens-young adult, is outside in the snow with her dog, BAILEY. They are both dressed in cute winter clothes: fuzzy hat and chic coat for Madison; reindeer sweater for Bailey. They have just been on a walk in the wintery wonderland and are on their way home when they spot a SNOWMAN come to life in front of their very eyes...

## MADISON

(to her dog, Bailey) Stay still, Bailey! Please, don't bark, sweetie! This is big—I mean, like Fuchsia-Diamond-Studded-Birkin-bag big. We do not want to lose this opportunity, especially on Christmas Eve!

(BAILEY murmurs)

Okay. Yes, I'll be quieter too.

(pause)

It's turning around...OMG, Bailey, it's looking right at us...But it's not smiling...

(pause)

Do you think it's intimidated by me because I'm an IG model? Poor thing... Let me get my phone out!

(reaches to get phone out of her pocket)

What do I—what do I say to it? I've never talked to snowman before!

(BAILEY murmurs)

Good idea, Bailey. I'll just visualize someone else instead...like...who do I always love running into...Oh! The Amazon delivery guy.

(visualizes)

Okay, um...

(to Snowman)

Hiiiieee! Um...Snowman... I'm Madison and I'm totally not scary. You can ask all my friends. I have like 250,000 followers, but I'm the nice kind of famous so you don't need to be worried. Oh, and this is Bailey. She's a rescue and everybody loves her too because she's in like, half my posts, and I'm just gonna take a real quick pic and then we can march in town or do whatever snowman thing you want to do, okay?

(Turns to take a selfie. Adjusts hair. The snowman turns away. Madison lowers her phone and quickly turns back to the snowman)

Wait-why are you turning back around? We can't see your face. Don't you wanna be in-

(BAILEY murmurs)

Oh, you could be right, Bailey. I hadn't thought of that. I'll ask. END OF EXCERPT
